From the Editors' Keyboard

This Ramadan, support your Islamic School

Assalamu-alaikum Cleveland!

A small step for a toddler. A giant leap for the community! History was made last year when twelve little toddlers stepped into the classroom of the school building at the Islamic Center of Cleveland (ICC). The first Full-time Islamic Preschool was established by Al Ihsan School, with generous support of the ICC and the community.

Alhamdulillah, the preschool has doubled its size this year and added a kindergarten grade as well. With two preschool classrooms and kindergarten, Al Ihsan School's enrollment at the ICC campus is over 30 students, Mashallah.

Al Ihsan's main campus, which includes grades K-6, is located on Masjid Al Islam's premises on Rocky River Drive. With the masjid's unwavering support, it has grown to capacity at this location. The school intends to add more classrooms next year by remodeling the existing building. At the same time, the branch at the ICC is planned to grow by the addition of Grade 1 next year, Inshallah. The expansion at the ICC is necessary not only for accommodating the increasing enrollment, but also to cater to the large Muslim community in the suburbs near Parma. The school plans to expand its support base in this area.

It is critical for the future of Islam in America that we establish Islamic Schools of the highest standard. A balanced curriculum, enriched with Quran and Islamic Studies, can only be provided at a full-time Islamic School. It is only in an Islamic School that a child will be able to *live* Islam on a daily basis. It is only in such schools that a child will have the right environment to blossom into a righteous Muslim.

For its ambitious, yet necessary projects, Al Ihsan School needs your support. The subsidized tuition alone does not help the school cover its costs. During the holy month of Ramadan, we urge you to donate generously to Al Ihsan School. It is permissible to use your zakah to support an Islamic School in the US. Voluntary charity will be sadaquah jaariya (perpetual charity), Inshallah. You can reach the school at (216)676-5006.

Al Ihsan School invites you to its Annual Ramadan Iftaar on Sunday, September 16. The guest speaker, Br. Habeeb Quadri will give a talk on **"Raising Muslim Children in America."** The event will be followed by an informal fundraiser. Born and raised in America, Br. Habeeb is well acquainted with the various challenges faced by our children and youth in schools and colleges. Do attend the iftaar to listen to Br. Habeeb and support Al Ihsan School. Ramadan and Eid Announcement by the Fiqh Council of North America

The Fiqh Council of North America in its meeting in Herndon, Virginia on July 31-August 1, 2007 noted with satisfaction the recent Fatwa of its counterpart in Europe "the European Council for Fatwa and Research" related to the permissibility of the use of calculation method for determining the beginning of Lunar months including the months of Ramadan and Shawwal.

The position of ECFR is very similar to the position of FCNA adopted last year on June 10, 2006, with a minor difference. FCNA adopted the position that the conjunction should occur before noon at Greenwich time. ECFR has adopted Makkah al-Mukarram as a conventional point and took the position that the conjunction must take place before sunset in Makkah and moon must set after sunset in Makkah.

FCNA after careful discussion has revised its position and has adopted the Fatwa of ECFR. This revised position will change only a few dates in the Fiqh Council's Five year calendar; but it will bring greater harmony and unity among the Muslims communities in the West.

Ramadan 1428 AH:

The astronomical New Moon is on Tuesday, September 11, 2007 at 12:44 Universal Time (3:44 pm Makkah time). Sunset at Makkah on September 11 is 6:28 pm local time, while moonset at Makkah is at 6:24 pm local time (4 minutes before sunset). This does not meet the new criteria adopted by Fiqh Council of North America (FCNA) and European Council of Fatwa and Research (ECFR). On Wednesday, September 12, 2007, sunset at Makkah is 6:27 pm local time, while moonset is at 6:55 pm local time. Therefore, first day of Ramadan is Thursday, September 13, insha'Allah.

Eid ul-Fitr 1428 AH:

The astronomical New Moon is on Thursday, October 11, 2007, at 5:00 Universal Time (8:00 am Makkah time). Sunset at Makkah on October 11 is 6:00 pm local time, while moonset at Makkah is at 5:59 pm local time (1 minute before sunset). This does not meet the new criteria adopted by FCNA and ECFR. On Friday, October 12, 2007, sunset at Makkah is 5:59 pm local time, while moonset is at 6:32 pm local time. Therefore, first day of Shawwal, i.e., Eid ul-Fitr is Saturday, October 13, insha'Allah.

On the basis of this new position, the dates for Ramadan and Eid ul Fitr for this year, according to the Fiqh Council of North America (FCNA), will be as follows:

First day of Ramadan: September 13, 2007

Eid ul Fitr (First day of Shawwal): October 13, 2007

Most masjid in the Cleveland area have adopted the FCNA ruling and will follow the above dates for the first day of Ramadan and Eid ul Fitr.

Masjid al Islam has decided to follow the sighting of the moon in the first Muslim country with which we share a part of the night. The first of Ramadan according to this methodology will also be on Sep 13.

Irrespective of the criterion adopted for determining the first day of Ramadan, the holy month is an opportunity for all of us to get closer to Allah and work towards strengthening our community.

The Completed Islam

“**O** You Believers! Enter into Submission (to Allah) with absolute dedication, and do not follow satan’s footsteps. Truly, he is a Clear Enemy to You”(Qur’an 2:208)

As Muslims, living over 14 centuries after this verse was first revealed to Prophet Muhammad [S.A.W.], we take for granted that we have indeed accepted Islam completely, that we are the “best” and “Most Balanced” of all those who believe in The Creator, and thus make the assumption that Quranic statements of this type are “Not addressing us”.

In the **Tafseer** literature, we come across a report that Jewish converts to Islam, including such personalities as *Abdullah ibn Salaam*, approached the Prophet asking for permission to continue certain aspects of their previous rituals in their Islamic lives! The report puts emphasis on their desire to *observe the Sabbath and even to recite the Torah in Salaah!* This verse {2:208} is said to be a direct response to those requests.

It can be argued that it is almost impossible for a person to accept Islam and *immediately* alter a lifetime of previous ideas, practices, and culture[s], however once we do accept Islam, Submission to Allah [S.W.T.], we should be *constantly seeking to obey Allah, to improve and strengthen our relationship with Allah.*

This means asking ourselves important questions and keeping in mind Allah’s command in the verse above! We would humbly suggest *Ramadan* as the perfect opportunity to do this. We are to read the Qur’an everyday during our fast, moreover, we often recite an entire section [Juz’] in the *Taraweeh* prayers.

Returning to the theme of this article, how much of the Qur’an have we truly studied and internalized? We are not only referring to memorization of its texts, but of actual *study?*

Have we internalized the Quranic teachings regarding Backbiting? Do we still hold to ideas which are contrary to the instructions of Allah?!

Our whole lives are to be in submission to the will and plan of God. We seek to obey him because it will give our lives meaning, enhancement and purpose, more so than anything else. We are instructed to surround our-

selves with friends and colleagues who will help us to grow in morality, spiritual awareness, and elevation.

This dedication requires that we constantly seek knowledge and important information, relevant to our Relationship with Allah. If we cannot read, we need to learn how to read.

“..And do not follow satan’s footsteps. Truly, he is a clear enemy to you”

Satan is the enemy of mankind. He whispers to our egos, our passions, he influences us to act and think contrary to the will of God. Satan can actually *take on the religious appearance!* Do we not see the wisdom behind Allah’s command to seek his (Allah’s) protection from satan before reading the Qur’an? (see Q 16:98)

Very few people would admit to satanic influences, most would deny it altogether. Nonetheless, when we have attitudes and notions that contradict *clearly* the *fundamentals of Islam*, we are suffering from Satan’s influence. We must always be careful about this, and seek to submit completely to Allah.

An Imam in the Middle Ages, ‘Abdul Qadir Al-Jilani [1078-1166], experienced a vision while in the midst of Prayers. In this “vision” he was told that “Your Lord has made Halal for you what he made Haraam for others”. Al-Jilani immediately recognized that this was simply satan.

May Allah give us the ability to submit to him completely, and may he always protect us from satan. Amin!

The Refugee Masjid - Update

Activities

- A Sunday school has been established. For two (2) hours every week Arabic & Quran classes are held for the Somali children and English is being taught to the mothers. The Turkish sisters are also being helped in getting conversant with Islam through home visits.
- To channel the energies of the youth, a soccer team has been established. They have been given uniforms and shoes and have played matches against teams from Columbus and Buffalo.
- Volunteers cleared the back yard of the brush and trees and a vegetable garden was planted. Ohio State Extension Service donated the plants. We have an abundance of tomatoes and peppers, only the rabbits got to enjoy the other vegetables planted.
- An office, staffed daily by volunteers from the Somali community, has been opened in one room of the Masjid. Families call in and are helped for doctor's appointment, school needs, social/welfare services, transportation etc.

The Masjid continues to be a focal point for the Somali Bantu Community and the attendance at prayer times has also increased.

The above has been made possible through the efforts of a group of young volunteers from the Islamic Center of Cleveland and the members of Salaam Cleveland. They have devoted many hours and money to this selfless cause.

Our Fiscal needs

The refugees mostly have large families with one wage earner working at minimum wages. Their sustenance is of course augmented by the welfare services but still it is a stretch to make ends meet. They collect enough money to pay for the utilities and the maintenance, but they do not have the resources to pay for the mortgage on the building.

The total asking price for the building was \$100,000 and with the community's generous donations over the past 2 years \$42,000 has been paid. The terms of the contract call for a \$20,000 down payment, \$600 per month mortgage payments, \$5000 balloon payment every year plus the cost of utilities and maintenance.

Our goal this Ramadan is to collect at least \$11,000 to cover the balloon payment and the mortgage for one year. Please be generous, insha-Allah we will exceed our target.

The checks are to be made out to MRI Society (Masjid Rasul-Allah Islamic Society). It is a tax exempt 501(C)(3) organization with a Federal Tax ID number 34-1794496.
